As I pen down this message reflecting on the journey of Glad Bharat Foundation in 2024–25, my heart is filled with both humility and gratitude. What began as a small step in 2019 has now grown into a movement of hope, dignity, and empowerment for thousands of children & women.

This year was particularly significant for us. We deepened our work in menstrual health through our partnership with Aditya Birla Education Trust, reaching over 3,700 women and girls across communities. We also made inroads in education through our pilot project SPARSH with the Pragati CSR Committee of IIM Bodhgaya, focusing on strengthening foundational literacy in one of their adopted villages.

Our initiatives, from PAD-ATMs in remote villages to Glad Bharat Paathshaala for out-of-school children, from women's livelihood training to youth internships, all reaffirm our belief that change happens when people and purpose come together.

This year was not without challenges—stigma, lack of awareness, and resource constraints often tested our resilience. Yet, what kept us going was the unwavering support from you, our partners, volunteers, interns, and above all, the trust of the communities we serve.

I extend my heartfelt gratitude to Aditya Birla Education Trust, IIM Bodhgaya Pragati CSR Committee, Inner Wheel Club, Jai Hind Project, and every individual who stood with us. You are not just partners—you are co-travelers in this mission.

Founded in 2019, Glad Bharat Foundation began with a vision to create grassroots change where it's needed most. What started as a small initiative in rural Gaya, Bihar quickly grew into a movement focused on foundational learning, menstrual dignity, health and community empowerment.

At Glad Bharat Foundation, we believe transformation begins when communities are heard, trusted, and empowered to lead their own progress.

EDUCATION

SPARSH

India's learning crisis is most visible at the primary level—children in under-resourced primary schools often struggle with reading and basic math. To address this, Glad Bharat Foundation launched Project SPARSH (Strengthening Primary Achievement through Resources, Support, and Holistic Learning).

In 2024–25, we began a pilot project in one of the IIM Bodhgaya adopted villages - Mahodar in Bodhgaya, with the Pragati CSR Committee as our knowledge and assessment partner.

01 Interventions

- Reading corners established in classrooms.
- Child-friendly teaching-learning material introduced.
- Regular assessments designed by IIM Bodhgaya team.
- Teacher support and parental engagement sessions conducted.

04 Impact

- Children demonstrated improved engagement and attendance.
- Teachers reported enhanced classroom participation.
- Parents began valuing literacy as the foundation for a better future.

This pilot is of 12 months and the impact and intervention is of 7 months till March 2025. It lays the groundwork for scaling SPARSH to 25 schools across Bodhgaya block, with a special focus on IIM Bodhgaya-adopted villages after this pilot in coming year.



EDUCATION

GLAD BHARAT PAATHSHAALA

In many rural areas, children often drop out of school due to poverty, seasonal migration, or lack of parental awareness about the importance of education. These gaps disrupt learning and make it difficult for children to re-enter formal schooling. Glad Bharat Paathshaala was designed to serve as a bridge, ensuring that children who were left behind could reconnect with education, rebuild their confidence, and smoothly transition into government schools.

01 Interventions

- Conducted bridge classes to help children catch up with curriculum basics.
- Provided individual attention to ensure age-appropriate learning levels.
- Engaged with parents and caregivers to raise awareness about consistent schooling.

Through this initiative, children who once stood at the margins of education are now confidently stepping back into classrooms. Glad Bharat Paathshaala has become a bridge of hope, ensuring that no child is left behind in the journey of learning.

Impact

- 60+ children enrolled into formal schools.
- Children built interest in learning letters and basics for smoother integration.
- Parents became more committed to their children's continued education.



MENSTRUAL DIGNITY

PAD-ATM

Access to affordable and dignified menstrual products remains a significant challenge for women in rural India. Many women travel long distances or rely on unhygienic alternatives due to stigma and lack of availability. To tackle this, Glad Bharat Foundation introduced PAD-ATMs—sanitary pad box operating mechanism—in remote villages of Bodhgaya block, ensuring women could access pads locally without hesitation.

01 Interventions

- New 5+ PAD-ATMs across rural villages in Bodhgaya block.
- Conducted “Charcha” sessions, creating safe spaces for open discussion on menstrual health.
- Partnered with local stakeholders to normalize access and reduce stigma.



04 Impact

- 2,000+ women reached through menstrual health education and awareness.
- Women now access pads conveniently in their own villages.
- Purchasing pads became stigma-free, as expressed by a community member, Rani—“For the first time, I don’t feel ashamed to get a pad. It is just like any other daily need now.”



SKILL DEVELOPMENT

Economic empowerment is vital for women to achieve independence and dignity. In underserved communities, lack of livelihood opportunities restricts women’s ability to contribute to household income or pursue self-reliance. To address this, Glad Bharat Foundation partnered with Inner Wheel Club to provide stitching training, equipping women with tailoring skills that can generate income and build confidence.

01 Interventions

- Conducted stitching training for 20+ women in partnership with Inner Wheel Club.



Impact

- Women gained new tailoring skills and the potential for income generation.
- Trained women began earning through stitching, fostering economic self-reliance.



HEALTH CHECK-UP & SCREENING CAMPS

Access to preventive healthcare is limited in many rural communities, leaving women and children vulnerable to illnesses. Recognizing this, Glad Bharat Foundation organized health and screening camps focusing on general health check-ups as well as menstrual health awareness. These camps aimed to identify health issues early, provide guidance, and create awareness about hygiene and well-being among women and girls.

01 Interventions

- Conducted general health check-ups for women and children in underserved villages.
- Engaged local health workers, and community volunteers to ensure wider outreach and follow-up care.



04 Impact

- 300+ women and children received screening, early detection, and referrals for health concerns.
- Strengthened community trust in accessing healthcare services and creating a culture of wellness.



About Project UJAAS

Menstrual health remains one of the most stigmatized and neglected issues in rural India. For many adolescent girls, menstruation becomes a reason to drop out of school, and for women, it often leads to shame, silence, and unsafe practices. Through Project Ujaas, supported by Aditya Birla Education Trust, we worked extensively in villages and schools in Assam and Haryana.

INTERVENTION

- Conducted 70+ menstrual health awareness sessions in schools and communities using interactive and participatory methods.
- Organized 20+ Nukkad Nataks to break stigma and initiate open discussions about menstruation.
- Created safe spaces for women and girls to ask questions and share experiences for the first time.
- Engaged mothers and community members to reinforce menstrual health awareness at home.



IMPACT

- 3,700+ women and girls reached directly through education and awareness activities.
- Increased knowledge of menstrual hygiene, health, and body awareness among participants.
- Women and girls became more confident and informed, reducing stigma around menstruation.
- Mothers and community members began actively supporting and discussing menstrual health, fostering sustained change.

DWDB CAMPAIGN

Every small contribution under DWDB became a stepping stone toward building dignity and opportunity for the less privileged.

In 2023–2024, Glad Bharat Foundation strengthened its DWDB (Donate Waste Discover Best) campaign, designed to instill a culture of giving and mindful resource use among students and institutions. Through this initiative, we partnered with 12+ schools and coaching institutes in Gaya, motivating young people to contribute towards the development of underserved communities. The campaign encouraged the collection of clothes, newspapers, used books, and copies, transforming everyday waste into valuable resources for those in need. DWDB is more than a donation drive—it is a movement that nurtures empathy, sustainability, and responsibility in the younger generation.

As part of the campaign, we also hosted a student seminar with private schools (classes 6–12), sparking dialogue on the importance of giving and how collective action can trigger social change.

Workshops were conducted with ASHA workers, community leaders, and health workers. The focus was on building local champions who can continue the conversation on menstrual health, education, and dignity on their own. This grassroots leadership approach ensures sustainability of our interventions.





INTERNSHIP & VOLUNTEERING



Empowering Young Minds For Social Inclination

Young minds bring energy, creativity, and fresh perspectives to social change. Recognizing this, Glad Bharat Foundation hosted interns from IIM Bodhgaya, UPES, LPU, and Central University during 2024–25. For many students, this was their first exposure to grassroots development work, offering a unique opportunity to experience rural realities, community dynamics, and challenges faced in education and health initiatives.

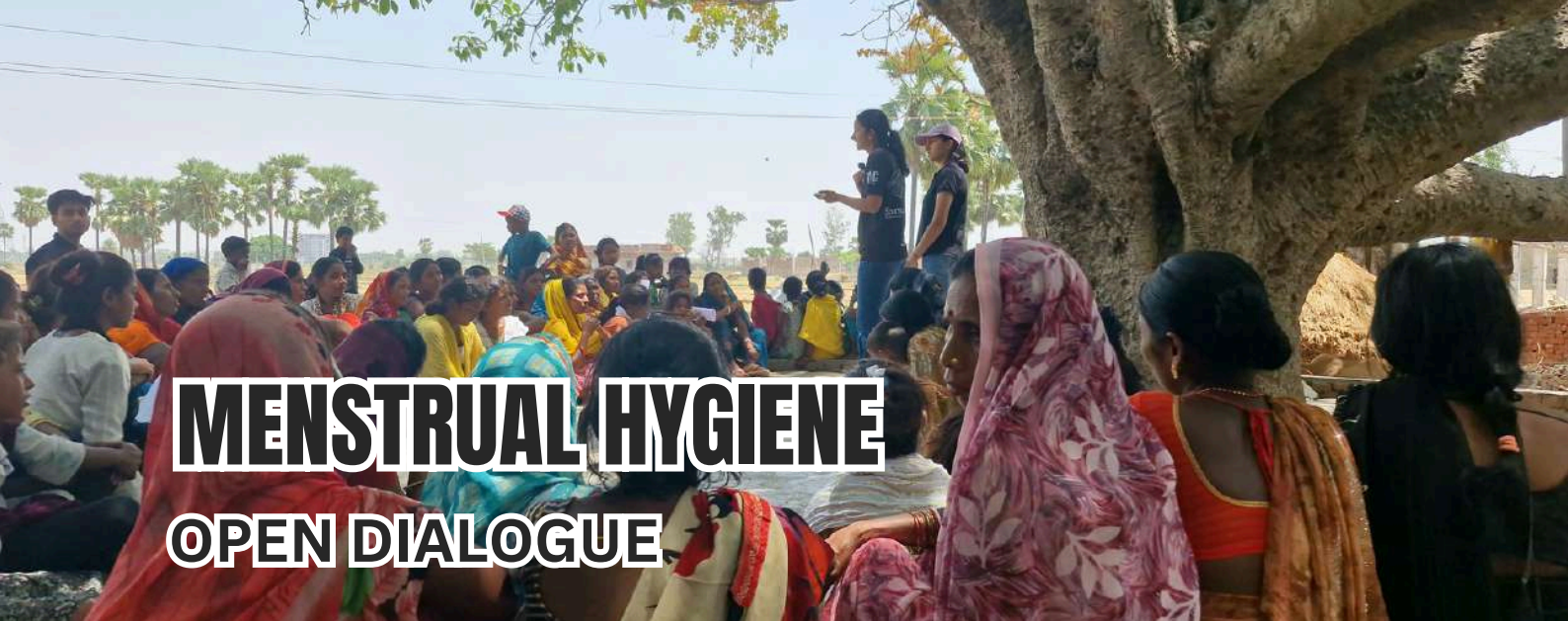


IMPACT
